SHOULD I REPORT TO SCHOOL?





Have you been in contact with someone who has tested POSITIVE for Covid-19?



NO, I have not.



Do you have Covid-19 symptoms?



YES, I do.



NO, I do not.



Stay at home,

monitor your

temperature, AND

contact your

YES, I have.



Remain home after 5 days if you continue to have a fever. You must be symptom free and fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication to return to school.

A negative test is not required to return to school.

Have you been exposed as a close contact?

YES, I have.

Close contact is defined as being within 6 feet of a positive case for 15 minutes or more.



YES, I was.



Are you vaccinated?



No, I was not, but there was a confirmed positive case in my class.



Return to school, but monitor for signs and symptoms up to 10 days. If symptoms develop, stay at home, monitor your temperature, AND contact your healthcare provider for evaluation and need for testing. You may return to school with a note from your doctor if symptoms subside AND you have been fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication.

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Report to school.

YES, I am.

If your COVID-19 vaccinations are up to date, you do not need to stay at home. Proof of vaccination may be required.

Over 18: You have received a Covid-19 booster dose or third dose OR you have received both doses of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine within the last six months, or a dose of Johnson & Johnson vaccine within the last two months.

Ages 5-17: You have received both doses of Pfizer vaccine.

You should wear a mask around others for the next 10 days.

5 days after your exposure, you should be tested for COVID-19 to make sure you are not infected.

If you develop symptoms, you should be tested, and stay home.

NO, I am not.

Stay at home for at least 5 days and wear a mask around others for an additional five days.

5 days after exposure, you should be tested for COVID-19 to make sure you are not infected.

If you develop symptoms, you should be tested, and stay home.
